come together to resist forces of division that spread misunderstanding and mistrust. We must maintain unity in order to help put our organization on track to meet the demands of our children, communities back home and communities here in the diaspora. We cannot allow hatred, bigotry, bitterness or the desire to get-even interfere in our march towards a united Ikwerre Ethnic Nationality.

Be assured that as we continue with your mandates and the mission of OIUSA, transparency and accountability will be front and center. The General Assembly set up a panel to look into and clear all questionable financial transactions resulting from the 2016 International Conference on Ikwerre (ICI). My team and I will assist them with everything to ensure that they finish their work by December 2019 and to enable us report back to you at the 2020 convention in Miami.

It is a mandate to re-engage with Ikwerre leadership at home, to foster unity among our Political, Traditional, Religious, etc. elites, to be able to advance the interest of the underprivileged, and to be a voice for them, as well as a voice for positive change in Ikwerre land. To start this reengagment process, we will begin at the grassroots by setting up a Medical Outreach Committee, with the aim of planning a Medical Mission, to help provide healthcare to underprivileged and underserved Ikwerre communities.

Continuity from one administration to the next is important to sustain an ongoing mandate. My team and I will be working with the former President, Mr. Chile Chuku to continue with the programs that he put in place, including, but not limited to the Grant requests from the Ford Foundation and NDDC. We will also follow up on the land request from the Governor of Rivers State, Chief (Barr) Nyesom Ezenwo Wike, for the building of Skills Acquisition Center from the previous administration. We will set up a committee to start and bring this project to fruition. This will be a positive step towards curbing youths' restiveness in Ikwerre land, and encourage self-reliance through entrepreneurship. Finally, looking beyond the past administration we also intend to follow up on some of the programs that prior administrations have proposed.

Through my involvement in various organizations, I've learned the importance of establishing clear priorities of governance, setting them out clearly for my team and the organization that we serve, and then focusing on them relentlessly. There is greater obligation on us and on me in particular, after the election to tell Ikwerre people very clearly what we must do to continue to strengthen OIUSA in the next two years.

The OIUSA executives and I assure you that we will spare no efforts to ensure that we are prepared to meet the challenges of this organization, and to have a hopeful future for a united Ikwerre Ethnic Nationality. We will see you all in Miami in 2020.
